

## THE HISTORY OF INTERNET

In the beginning of the 1970's in USA was an older military network called ARPANET converted to Internetwork which was a network between networks. Except a few Universities was it foremost enterprises and organisations which was important for the American army who was connected to Internetwork.

Reasons of security made Internetwork anarchistic. It wasn't supposed to be any central computer which controlled Internetwork and the computer traffic was supposed to direct itself so if a thought road suddenly wasn't accessible the traffic should find a new way by itself. Two years later the next revolution WWW was released. WWW made it able for ordinary people to surf on internet. Internet began to grow very fast 1993 it became possible for enterprises to rent access to internet to private persons. At the same time it came a new generation of modem more than 10 times faster than the old ones this made connection for private persons possible.
